#### ERIK SATIE

May 17, 1866-July 1, 1925

Erik Satie was an eccentric French composer whose rather carefree lifestyle attracted a group of friends composed primarily of musicians, poets, dancers and artists. His father was a music publisher in Paris, and thus the young Satie studied music from an early age. At the age of 13 he began studying organ with Alexander Guilmant at the Paris Conservatory but shortly thereafter stopped his musical training and began playing piano for various shows and cabarets. Like Debussy, Satie's early works were scorned by music critics because they were written to ridicule standard compositional practices of the day. It was through Debussy's friendship and encouragement that Satie decided to return to music study, and so at the age of 40 Satie began his formal training in composition. Even so, other composers thought Satie uneducated, and his music did not receive serious recognition until after his death. In addition to works for piano, Satie also composed ballets and orchestral and ensemble works.
