FUNDAMENTAL EXERCISES

The symbol is called a "treble clef".

The symbol C stands for 4/4 (four-quarter) rhythm. In this kind of rhythm there are four beats to each measure and a quarter note () receives one beat, a half note () receives two beats, and a whole note (o) receives four beats.

On this page we shall deal with only whole notes and whole rests (-) each of which receives four beats.

The fingering is indicated below each note when it is first introduced. "1" refers to the first valve (the one nearest to the mouthpiece), "2" refers to the middle valve, and "3" refers to the third valve (the one closest to the bell). Combinations of valves are shown by $\binom{1}{2}$ meaning "1st and 2nd valves" and $\binom{1}{3}$ meaning "1st and 3rd valves," etc.

The valves employed on any given note must be completely depressed; those not used are to be all the way UP.

Your instructor may wish to add other notes or rhythmic figures on the blank staves provided for that purpose.
