Occasional Notes

Occasional Notes was composed as a series of "open letters" to friends. As Ned Rorem has said, "Critics of words use words, critics of music use words." As a composer, I feel I speak better with music. Nos. 3, 4, and 5 were birthday presents. The title, Consider the Rain, is drawn from a lovely ensemble piece in Blitzstein's opera, Regina. Although I never knew Blitzstein, his influence on my music has been great. The title, Look Down, Fair Moon, is drawn from a poem of the same name by Walt Whitman. The melody is drawn from my choral setting of that poem. The chorale from No. 7 figures prominently in a symphony I composed in memory of Norman Stumpf.

The suite may be split up and performed as separate pieces; the order indicated in the score is suggested for performances of the entire suite. The work received its first performance on March 28, 1985 at the Chapel of Saint Paul on Columbia University campus. Robert Gallagher performed the piece and created the registrations indicated in the score; his playing was an inspiration throughout the compilation of the suite.
