

Introducing The Piano Keyboard

Middle Section



The names of the piano keys are A-B-C-D-E-F-G.

The black keys are in groups of two and three.

Keyboard Drills

- 1 Beginning with A, the lowest key at the left end of the keyboard, play with one finger and name all white keys.
- 2 MIDDLE C is the C nearest the middle of the keyboard. Find and play it.
- 3 Beginning with thumb of Right Hand and using the fingers in order, play MIDDLE C-D-E. Name each key as it is played.
- 4 Find and play other groups of C-D-E higher on the keyboard.
- 5 Beginning with thumb of Left Hand and using the fingers in order, play MIDDLE C-B-A. Name each key as it is played.
- 6 Find and play other groups of C-B-A lower on the keyboard.
